2. Background

The Office of the Assistant Secretary of War for Industrial Base Policy (OASW(IBP)) invites representatives from the Defense Industrial Base (DIB) to participate in networking sessions at the 2026 Defense Industrial Base Accelerator (DIBX), centered on this year's theme of Revolutionizing Defense Investment. These sessions are focused on building a more resilient, secure, and integrated DIB by aggressively expanding industry participation and lowering barriers for new entrants. These targeted sessions will offer a forum to provide the DoW with insights and recommendations to cultivate a broader vendor base. In addition, the DoW welcomes insight into current structural hurdles, from initial contract onboarding to cybersecurity posture, as well as constructive suggestions for an enhanced, collaborative framework going forward.

3. Sources Sought Notice

To supercharge the DIB under the theme of Revolutionizing Defense Investment, OASW(IBP) is conducting networking sessions at the 2026 Defense Industrial Base Accelerator.

These sessions will focus on gathering industry feedback to build a more resilient, secure, and integrated DIB. OASW(IBP) is specifically seeking feedback on three critical operational areas:

- **New Entrants and Barriers to Entry:** Identifying and eliminating friction points that prevent non-traditional and emerging companies from doing business with the DoW.
- **Sector Focus Areas:** Industry insights and solutions to critical DIB focus areas (e.g., kinetics, strategic & critical materials, microelectronics, workforce, energy storage and batteries, manufacturing, forward manufacturing, civil reserve manufacturing network (CRMN), CMMC, etc)
- **DIB Policy and Strategy feedback:** Shaping our strategy and identifying opportunities for alignment, optimization, and enhanced collaboration.

Responses and session registrations are invited from all interested parties, including small businesses, non-traditional defense contractors, and large organizations.

OASW(IBP) will schedule unclassified networking sessions (10-15 minutes) with each down selected organization. We recommend having not more than two representatives from your organization participate in these sessions to maximize discussion time and focus. While no special presentation equipment is required, participants are welcome to bring any reference materials they find helpful (such as capability briefs, laptops, tablets, or notebooks) to facilitate the discussion.

4. Submission Requirements

Interested entities should reply with applicable responses to the following:

a) Provide a brief overview of your company, including your primary business focus, core capabilities, and whether you classify as a traditional defense contractor, a non-traditional entity, or an emerging startup.

- Describe your organization's historical experience working with the DoW or, if you are a new entrant, your experience in the broader commercial market.

b) What specific friction points, hurdles, or compliance challenges have you encountered when attempting to enter the DoW market, win contracts, or scale your production capacity?

- Provide specific examples of how these barriers to entry have impacted your project timelines, operational costs, or ability to deliver innovative solutions.

c) What immediate changes could the DoW implement to eliminate friction points and streamline the acquisition process for non-traditional or emerging companies?

- Highlight any specific processes or compliance mechanisms that could be adapted to lower barriers to entry.

d) Which of the DoW's critical sector focus areas (e.g., kinetics, strategic & critical materials, microelectronics, workforce, energy storage and batteries, manufacturing, forward manufacturing, Civil Reserve Manufacturing Network [CRMN], CMMC, etc.) best aligns with your companies' capabilities?

- Describe the specific technologies or innovative approaches your company is developing to address capability gaps or vulnerabilities within these targeted sectors.

e) What specific obstacles have you faced when attempting to introduce or scale new technologies within these critical sectors for DoW needs?

- Include examples of supply chain limitations, testing requirements, or scaling challenges, and propose how the DoW can help overcome them.

f) Based on your experience, what actionable policy changes or process optimizations could the DoW implement to better align its strategies with modern commercial industry practices?

- Highlight any specific structural challenges related to public-private partnerships or compliance mandates that currently hinder optimal collaboration, and propose methods for improvement.

g) How can the DoW improve its communication and engagement with industry to more effectively shape its strategy, forecast its needs, and solicit feedback?

- Provide suggestions for fostering stronger alignment and a more resilient Defense Industrial Base (DIB).

All responses should be no more than two (2) pages in total and shall be submitted electronically no later than August 7, 2026 using the following link:

Entities must reply demonstrating their ability to comply with the requirements in this Sources Sought Notice in order to be considered capable of satisfying the Government requirement.

All interested entities having the experience, skills and capabilities necessary to fulfil the stated requirements are requested to provide a brief description of their company along with answers to the prompts in section 4, listed above. If providing an attachment, responses should not exceed two (2) pages in "Times New Roman" 12-inch font on 8.5 x 11 paper.

To facilitate a timely and comprehensive review of all submitted responses, entities should respond using the format requested to this Notice.
